Using Your Library Card: Priceless

When Russell Jones moved with his family from Oklahoma to Beavercreek in 1972, he visited the nearest Greene County Community Library only to be underwhelmed by its size and selection. "It used to be in a rented store just off Dayton-Xenia Road where Lofino's Plaza is located," he says in describing his first impression. "When I went there with my family I was just amazed. I thought, 'Oh, this is the library in Beavercreek? What have we gotten into?'"

Little did Russell know that stepping into that small rented store in Lofino's Plaza marked the beginning of a relationship that continues to grow today and still saves Russell money. Having checked out 10,000 items on his current library card—and an estimated 50,000 items since 1972—Russell is the Greene County Public Library's most loyal patron. As the library changed locations and continued to grow so did his interests. "It's not just one area that I'm limited to in viewpoints. The library has so many resources, so many magazines, so many opportunities," he says. "Let's take advantage of the library. Let's go to the library. Let's use the library." And with an average of 103 checkouts per month, Russell certainly takes advantage of the materials available at the library.

To put Russell's library usage in terms of dollars and cents, he checks out \$1,885 worth of materials per month. In today's economy that means Russell has used nearly one million dollars worth of materials in his four decades as a patron. But the monetary value takes a backseat when Russell discusses the value of the library. "The library has done quite a bit to reach out to the community and makes a lot of services available that may have not been available years ago." Among the services the library offers are the Volunteer Income

Tax Assistance program, and a variety of presentations for children, teens, and adults. Russell recently attended a Facebook program and found it informative and entertaining.

Russell is proud of his personal motto, "The Library is a great place to be." These are words Russell lives by. As an active member of the library, he finds himself frequenting mainly the Beavercreek and Fairborn locations and occasionally the Xenia Library as well as giving back through the Friends of the Library. His philosophy is simple: "Helping the library means helping the rest of the community."

2012 Big Read Announced: *Zeitoun* by Dave Eggers

After much deliberation, 2012's Big Read was announced as *Zeitoun* by Dave Eggers. To stay up to date on Big Read book discussion dates and other programs, check our calendar of events.

When Hurricane Katrina struck New Orleans, Abdulrahman Zeitoun, a prosperous Syrian-American and father of four, chose to brave the storm and protect his house and contracting business. In the days following the storm, Zeitoun traveled the flooded streets in a secondhand canoe, passing on supplies and helping others in need. A week later, on September 6, 2005, while the wounds of Katrina were still fresh on the American consciousness, Zeitoun abruptly disappeared. Eggers's riveting nonfiction book explores Zeitoun's roots in Syria, his marriage to Kathy—an American who converted to Islam—and their children. It also critically examines the surreal atmosphere of New Orleans—and the United States in general—immediately following the devastation of Hurricane Katrina. Like Eggers's other works, *Zeitoun* was written in close collaboration with its subjects and involved vast research—a process taking nearly three years and spanning the globe from the United States, to Spain and Syria.

Free Tax Services Available Through the Library

Greene County Public Library is once again coordinating with VITA personnel to offer free tax assistance to area residents. Tax volunteers will be at the Xenia Library on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, starting January 23 through April 16. The Xenia Library tax assistance takes place in the downstairs meeting room, & patrons are seen on a first come, first served basis.

Beavercreek Community Library also hosts VITA personnel on select Saturdays. Patrons must schedule an appointment for a Saturday session.

Now in its twenty-sixth year partnering with the library, VITA has helped area residents claim millions of dollars in tax returns. In 2011 over 2,000 people utilized the service, totaling more than two million dollars worth of returns. Library Director Karl Colón says he is honored to host VITA. "It's an extremely valuable service," he says. "VITA helps local money stay local." VITA clients can expect assistance with any aspect of the tax filing & return process. Tax volunteers are trained in Federal, State [Ohio] and School District Income Tax Returns preparation, and can e-file all three returns for their clients. In some instances, people already have their taxes completed and only want someone to double-check them. Volunteers will be glad to assist those clients as well.

Clients can rest assured their returns are prepared in accordance with tax law and transmitted via computer. Using the computer and library-provided services speeds up refunds for those receiving one.



Library has the Tax Forms You Need

All locations of the Greene County Public Library have tax forms available in a variety of formats. Free copies of federal and state tax forms are provided, and most locations have municipal and school district forms. A notebook of federal forms, photocopy-ready for 15 cents per page, is also provided at each location.

Links are available on the library website (www.greenelibrary.info) for federal, state, city, and school district forms. Forms are also available by printer for 15 cents per page from the library's Internet computers. For the convenience & security of its patrons, the library does not recommend filing tax returns on library computers.
